ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The last year has gone by quickly and another national conference is fast approaching. Looking back on the last few months I am happy to say that I feel we have completed some benchmark achievements. Most notable of which is the solidifying of our relationship with NACA.

Through the efforts of Earle Taylor, Fabian James, the Government of Canada and the Board of Directors, we were able to meet with the heads of NACA and come to common ground on the principals of building a tighter relationship between the two organizations.

I am confident that this will do two things for COCA: (1) increase the Organization's profile enabling it to better apply for grant monies and in turn create a more robust and effective base to support its school and associate members; and (2) this relationship will make it easier for associates to look into the US market. While the seeds are being planted for this relationship, it will take ongoing dialog and exchange between the two organizations in order to realize its full potential.

We have also had similar conversations with our equivalent organization in the UK. This looks to be a promising relationship as well but will likely take longer to bring to fruition. In both cases COCA has taken a leading role in negotiating and facilitating these discussions.

Another focus of the COCA Board this year was to improve the quality of Ed Sessions at the regional and national level. This will be an ongoing task that will require the participation of the associates, school members and the Board. In short we have identified that this is an area of value to all people involved with the Organization and that more effort must be applied to improve the quality of education provided at COCA conferences. More focus will be placed on all aspects of programming and less on "buying the big band and agents". We welcome your input on what you would like to see in this regard.

All in all it has been a good year for the Associate Members and for COCA.

The end of last year and the first few months of this year have been a flurry of professional accomplishments for Steve Santini, aka "The Dark Master of Escape."

New Years Eve saw Santini as a featured performer on Canada's New Years Eve Bash filmed live at Nathan Phillips Square in Toronto and broadcast nationally across Canada.

At this event, presented by the CITY TV, CHUM Television, and i STAR TV networks, Santini successfully escaped from a locked steel bank vault that was being blasted on three sides by propane flamethrowers, turning it into a virtual oven!

The escape was witnessed by over 35,000 live audience members and was broadcast by satellite across Canada to over 15 million viewers.

In the month following the New Year's broadcast, Santini was officially named, "The World's Most Extreme Escape Artist" by the legendary, "Ripley's Believe it or Not!" and a full page spread on his work and career will appear in the soon to be released Ripley's book, "Expect the Unexpected!"

The last few months have seen performances and tours by Steve Santini in Germany and the Dominican Republic and he has also been busy putting finishing touches on a script treatment for a new reality series he will star in called, "Get out of THAT!"

A new, 300 page, French translation of my last book, entitled, 'L'anarchiste et le diable' (Lux Editeur, 2006) comes out this month. Again, I'll tour Québec and francophone communities across Canada later this Summer and Fall, and Europe as well. Otherwise, I'm working on a collection of essays about my creative work, and a new book of poetry.

PART TIME FACULTY

I started teaching part-time at Concordia last Fall, in the School of Community and Public Affairs, and will continue in between future touring.

I teach a grad-level course about the arts and community economic development.

MSVU Hosts First-Ever East Coast Campus Idol

November 15, 2005, Halifax - Mount Saint Vincent University (MSVU) will come alive with the sound of music this Friday, Nov. 18 at 8 p.m. The Halifax university will make history as it hosts the first-ever East Coast Campus Idol.

Competitors from universities around the Maritimes will take the stage at the Seton Auditorium to compete for this coveted title.

"It's going to be an amazing show," says Matt Currie, Vice-President Student Life at MSVU. "We're going to have some of the best, undiscovered talent in the region on one stage. Move over Kalen Porter and Melissa O'Neil!"

Campus competitions were held last month at Dalhousie University, Saint Mary's University, Mount Allison University, St. Francis Xavier University, Cape Breton University and MSVU to determine who would represent their school. MSVU's Campus Idol drew crowds of more than 200 to the campus pub every week. The finale was held on November 2, where Lindsay Smith was selected to represent MSVU. Now Lindsay and her five competitors will vie for the top spot in the region.

Cyril Lunney from CTV's Breakfast Television will host the event. Celebrity judges include former Canadian Idol hopeful Kaleb Simmonds, country singer John Morgan and Shane Ross, Entertainment Editor with HFX News.

Tickets are on sale now at the various universities. They are \$3 for students and \$5 for everyone else. The ticket price also includes access to the after-party at Vinnie's Pub in MSVU's Rosaria Student Centre, where Simmonds will also perform.

"This could be just the beginning," says Currie. "Similar competitions are being held in Central and Western Canada. Who knows, one day we might even have a Canadian Campus Idol."
